The only notable establishment in the rocky terrain of Thenhipalam was the Calicut University in the 1970s. The natives as well as the employees of the University who came from other parts of the State were in need of a school that rendered quality education in English Medium. When the desire became a dire necessity, the concerted effort of a group of University professors and Jesuit fathers culminated in the establishment St Paul's High School.

Early in 1975, the then Jesuit Provincial of Kerala Province Rev Fr Paul Vadakkal and University professors Dr C P Xavier, Dr John Ochanthuruthu and Dr J C Palathinkal visited the Bethany Generalate in Mangalore with a request to start an English Medium School in Thenhipalam. They met Mother Macrina, the



The pioneering members Mother Eliza, the Superior, Sr Prabha Headmistress, Sr Agnesia, Sr Floscula and Sr Canute started the mission of Bethany here residing in a rented house of Mr Balan Nair. Their prime concern was for education and pastoral ministry. As there was no building of our own, the school was started in "Archana" a small building belonging to the Jesuit Fathers. There were 44 students in the beginning comprising of three sections - KG, class one and five. The laying of the foundation stone for the new building was done on 1 May 1976 by the Diocesan Vicar General Rev Fr Joseph Edamaram. On 31 December 1976 the new building was blessed and sisters shifted their residence from the rented house to this building. The constant and earnest endeavours of the sisters and their dedication to the cause over the years have made the rocky terrain land



Mother General of the Congregation of the Sisters of Little Flower of Bethany, and convinced her of the need of a school in Thenhipalam. Mother who understood the importance of the requirement discussed the matter with the Bishop of Calicut Most Rev Dr Aldo Patroni and procured the necessary permission for starting the school.

The new venture was officially started on July 5, 1975. The Pro-vice Chancellor of Calicut University Dr Sukumar Azheekode, Vicar General of Calicut Diocese Rev Fr Joseph Edamaram, Jesuit Provincial Fr Paul Vadakkal, University Registrar Mr Koshy, Professors John Ochanthuruthu, Dr Xavier, sisters from West Hill Convent and many other eminent personalities were present as Mother Esperie, on behalf of the Mother General, read out the declaration to start the convent and the school.



into one of enchanting beauty and joy. Today the school is one of the pioneer institutions run by the Bethany Educational Society in Kerala.

The first batch of SSLC appeared in 1982 for the board exam and established a record of 100% pass. In the year 2002 the school was granted permission to start Plus Two. St Paul's Higher



Secondary School is now an educational complex with a KG Block, HS Block and HSS Block. To cater to the need of the poor girls in the locality a Govt recognized Tailoring School also was started.

Bethany can be proud that many students who have passed out of this institute are now occupying important positions in the society taking Bethany values along wherever they are.



The school has at present a total strength of over 2000 students and a band of 70 dedicated faculty. It has well established science labs, computer labs, mathematics lab, digitalized Smart classrooms and a good library. Cent percent performance in the Board Examinations and over-all championships in youth festivals at State level and Exhibitions are a monopoly of the school. Active participation both in curricular



and co-curricular activities, excellent academic outputs and a green and clean



campus teeming with life and leisure make this school unique and dear to many – a home away from home. The tiny spark of inspiration over the years has grown into a great conflagration producing a galaxy of stars to the mainstream of the society and relentlessly march ahead under the able guidance of Sr Anitha Mary BS, the Principal and Sr Anseline BS, the Local Manager.

There are no helpers or the supportive staff either at schools or at home. Believe me the whole school was cleaned by the students themselves. We just say 'Cleanliness is next to Godliness' and they actually practice it.

This did not end up on clean surroundings but a 'clean myself' exercise too. As a part of their oral

hygiene they even carried toothbrushes and changed uniforms for various field tasks and learning periods. Moreover, one could spot a hand sanitizer in every nook and corner, be it school, home, a store or a shopping mall.



There is another experience that intrigued me initially. The students who commuted by cars to school became a laughing stock. I wondered, in India we feel proud commuting by our swanky cars. But here the students took pride in commuting by bicycles or on foot. Humility is what they pass on to all.

Yet another amazing experience there has enriched me from within. I was able to experience my own versatility. I could weed out tomatoes and carrots in the school herbarium, fertilize the orange trees during agriculture periods, plant seedlings by the method of hydroponics, sew kimonos iconic dress of Japanese culture in the sewing classes and pet rabbits and rats in my petting classes, cook Japanese bread in the Food Production classes studied Mathematics, Japanese, played badminton, outdoor games and so many other things that helped me Akanksha know myself better.
