In response to our Founder's Charism 'Compassionate love, especially for the poor and zeal for the proclamation of the Gospel', the



Sisters of the Northern Province, guided by Sr Canice, the then Regional Superior, under the leadership of Sr Sylvine the then Superior General began their ministry in June 1985 at Mahuatoli, a remote village in Ranchi District (Jharkhand). The first members were Sisters Rosia, Rose Rita and Neelam. Living among the village folk in the far-flung area, sharing their residence and life, being together as a community and involving themselves in the proclamation of the good news and the empowerment of the poor and the marginalized was a unique experience and a great inspiration for them. Sr Canice assumed the responsibility of this mission in July 1986 and continued with same vigour under the able guidance of Sr Wilberta the then Provincial Superior of the Northern Province.

On 7 February 1987 with the blessings of Archbishop Telespore P Toppo the Sisters shifted their residence to Mc Mandro, Ranchi (Jharkhand) as he graciously offered 3 acres of land of the Diocese to the Sisters with an old structure which served as their residence. The K.G Hindi Medium School started in 1986 with



30 chidren by Fr Lawrence Kujur, the then Parish priest was handed over to the Sisters. Sr Canice took charge of the school, while Sr Rosia and Sr Melvice continued social-pastoral ministry at Mc Mandro and surrounding villages.

In the initial years there was lot of resistance from the local people. Braving all the challenges the Sisters continued their pastoral, educational and socio-medical ministry with undaunted courage under the leadership of Srs Zeena. Erasma, Gracy D'Souza, Stella D'Souza, Yvonne, Rositta, Rose Rita and Sr Dulcine. Bethany Convent Hindi Medium School too made steady progress under the guidance of Srs Oliva, Yvonne, Winnifred and Shamitha. Srs Stella D'Souza, Gracy D'Souza, Priyanjali, Gracy Natal and Prisca Toppo contributed greatly to the uplift of the poor and the marginalized through the socio-pastoral care, while Srs Lancia, Rositta, Shobha, Joselita touched the lives of numerous people through the medical ministry.



Bethany Tribal Girls' Hostel was opened in 2004 with a few poor tribal girls from the surrounding villages. It continues to be a boon to the financially deprived children. Later in 2006, Bethany formation programme was started for 'Come and See candidates. Sr Nora and Sr Hilerian served as the Directresses.

Bethany Convent School marched forward under the leadership of successive Headmistresses. Sr Karuna the present Headmistress with her zeal, and persevering efforts has succeeded in securing the recognition from the State Government for the Primary and the High School separately in July and August 2016 respectively. It is a matter of great joy to all of us and those connected with the school from its inception.

Even though the school was not recognized in the past years, with good contacts the campus cruy



Headmistresses were able to secure Government facilities, such as cycles for High School students, uniform for girl students and stipend for all children. Over the years, dignitaries, Most Rev Telespore Toppo, the Archbishop of Ranchi, -Sr Agnella, Sr Jyoti, Sr Wilberta - Superiors General, Sr Miriam, Nora, Maria Leena -Provincial Superiors, members of the Legislative Assembly, District Commissioners, Block Developmental Officers and Block Education officers have visited the school and have encouraged the staff and students. Seven batches of students have answered X Std Board Examination securing good results. In the past year we had 100% result with good marks. They also participated successfully in the cocurricular and sports activities at different levels, including the State level. Truly our Founder's dream of educating and empowering the least ones is getting realized.

Currently Sr Supreetha, the Superior of the community gives great service through her animation and healing ministry. The School headed by Sr Karuna has 710 students on its roll. Sisters Sunita Toppo, Neharika and Suchitha join the band of dedicated 26 staff members. 48 children in Bethany Tribal Girls'

Northern Province was bifurcated and the Eastern Province was formed on 08 December 2014 with Sr Shaila as its first Provincial Superior. Mc Mandro mission, a part of the Eastern Province has received immense support from her and her team. This Bethany sapling of Mc Mandro had been the beneficiary of the benevolent services of the Northern Province as well as the Bethany Generalate since its foundation.

I raise my heart in gratitude to God for the numerous blessings we have received during the past 31 years. One such great blessing is the gift of this place offered to us by the Archbishop. Mc Mandro, situated on Ranchi-Mandar High



way is 15 K.M away from Ranchi. The campus is full of Litchi trees; the lush green surrounding, is really beautiful. The weather is comparatively pleasant. We are blessed with modest buildings for Convent, School, Dispensary and Hostel. The Parish Priest is very supportive. The Sisters and the inmates of the campus and parishioners have daily Holy Eucharist in the parochial house and on Sundays it is celebrated in the School Hall; indeed it is a blessing!

The community rejoices at the great blessings and joins our Blessed Mother to sing the mercies of the Lord. We pray that this mission moves as per the desire of our Founder.

St Joseph Viswema, Nagaland



Viswema village is situated about 25 km South of Kohima, the State capital of Nagaland. The hillock on which the Catholic Mission was built was considered "unclean land". During the Second World War, the Japanese had used it as their base, digging trenches and hiding in them. At the end of the war, they buried their ammunition here. Numerous empty and half empty shells were found while preparing for the



foundation of the convent and school. However this unclean land has become a source of blessings to Bethany, the church and the village. Viswema was one of the villages managed by the Jesuits of Karnataka Province. Rev. Fr Alexis Menezes SJ, the then Provincial of the Karnataka Jesuits struck a deal with Mother Macrina, the then Superior General to send sisters to this infant mission.

It was the initiative of Jesuit pioneer Fr Stanislaus Coelho SJ, a Jesuit Missionary from Karnataka Province to begin an English medium school in Viswema. The villagers were open to the idea of English education and generously donated land for the same. The school was formally opened on 19 March 1974 and dedicated to St Joseph.

Bethany ventured into this village in 1977. The pioneers of this mission Sr Noeline, the Superior and Headmistress, Sr Peace, Sr Ivan and Sr A P Tresa, set foot on this holy ground on 10 February 1977. The first four received a solemn welcome at Dimapur by Most Rev. Abraham Alangimattathil SDB, Bishop of Kohima. They stayed with Sisters of Apostolic Carmel for a few

months as the convent building was not ready. One of the pioneers recalls the inauguration of their mission; "On that evening Fr Stany Coelho presented each of the pioneers an Angami prayer book and said, from today you may do any good work at Viswema. Then he drove them to Viswema.

The sisters lost no time in launching their ministry and began the classes the next day. The school cum convent building was under construction, therefore a thatched shed served as school. The new school cum convent building built at the expenses of the mission was blessed and inaugurated by Bishop Abraham Alangimattathil SDB on 14 March 1977 in the presence of many priests, sisters and people. On this occasion sisters were blessed and welcomed by the oldest man of the village by offering to each of them Angami traditional shawl.

Like new missions everywhere, Viswema mission started out with a multi-pronged approach. Formal teaching in the school, informal teaching after school, house visits, prayers, catechesis, health and hygiene education; all possible methods were used in order to have good news



preached. The sisters' activities were not restricted to Viswema alone; but they reached out to neighbouring villages – Kedima, Kezoma, Khuzama, Khezokonoma etc.

The foundation for a new convent building was laid by Fr Coelho on 23 December 1986, on the death anniversary of the Founder. The new convent was built at the expense of the Congregation and was inaugurated on 4 April 1988, by Bishop Abraham.

Bethany sisters came to be part of the school in 1977. At that time, the school had reached up to class 2 with 80 students on roll. By 1986 the school reached up to class 8 with 450 students on roll. The management of St Joseph School was transferred to Bethany sisters on 8 September

1986, from the Jesuits through the Diocese. The first batch of students wrote their matriculation exam in December 1989 with excellent results. The construction of a new school building began in January 1990. The work of the new school



building was completed in 1994 and blessed by Fr Castelino SJ. The school received conditional recognition from the Nagaland Board of School Education in 1992, which meant that students could appear for class 10 examinations in the name of the school. Till about the mid 90s most of the teachers were from outside Nagaland, particularly from South India, Manipur and Assam. At present teachers are from the village itself and most of them are Ex-students.

In 2009, the school was upgraded to higher Secondary level in Arts Stream. It necessitated the construction of another wing for higher secondary in the same year funded by Bethany Educational Society. The new block was blessed by Fr Neisalhou Carolus and inaugurated by Rev. Sr Wilberta, the then Superior General on 22 October 2010.

Sr Noeline was the first Headmistress and the subsequent Headmistresses were Sr Selina, Sr Ordelia, Sr Chrisette, Sr Carol, Sr Sumitha, Sr Janet Mendonca and at present Sr Harsha assisted by a steady band of committed sisters and dedicated staff. They have steered the course of education with courage and vision.

Being the first High school and Hr Sec. School of Bethany Educational Society in the North East, St Joseph School has enjoyed the special love and tender care of the Province and the Generalate team whose help especially financial, made it possible to maintain well this village school.

The school caters to students mainly from our village. In addition 100 children came from the neighbouring villages. Our village Viswema has four government L P. Schools, one higher

primary school, two high schools and a higher secondary school other than St Joseph Hr Sec. School. The children are distributed in all these schools; therefore the enrollment always remains between 500-550 students even after 42 years of its existence. Right from its inception we have been recipient of help and support from the Provincialate and Generalate since the school is not self-sufficient due to low enrolment. We remain grateful to our past and present, Superiors General and Provincial Superiors and their team, Bethany Educational Society Mangalore and BES North East Province for every help.

With the permission of the Bishop of Kohima, the formation house was opened in 1986 and "Come and See" programme began the same year. Sr Lucy Maria was the first Candidates in charge followed by Sr Selina. Later student-candidates were kept to pursue their studies along with the training for religious life. Bethany had the joy of having the first vocation from this village in the person of Sr Agatha Vitsu who made her first profession in 2011. Sr Adu Celine, Sr Teresa Sulahele, Sr Gladys were the fruits of this mission. We have quite many sisters from the North East who stayed in this formation house either for their high school or higher secondary school education. At present we have 8 candidates studying in class 11 and 12.

Closely attached to the school is the hostel apostolate. Thirteen hostellers joined on 18 July 1977 and at present we admit girls from KG I to Class 12 and boys up to Class 4. Most of them are from the neighboring villages where they are



deprived of the school facilities. Children are well taken care, providing them with ample opportunities for their all round development.

From the very beginning the medical needs of the people were taken care by the sisters. The sisters started moving out to the villages with medicine that the sisters were able to enter the villages. As the years rolled by and the demands of the mission increased, the activities of the sisters became more organized in medical and social field besides education. Sr Alice Thomas was the first full time nurse followed by Sr Marie Celine and others bringing their own expertise, added quality and quantity to the ministry.

The superiors who shouldered the responsibility of the mission at Viswema were Sr Noeline,

Sr Selina, Sr Ordelia, Sr Chrisette, Sr Carol, Sr Jean Marie, Sr Leena Serrao and at present Sr Harsha. The sisters at Viswema are indebted to the Jesuit Fathers at Loyola Jakhama and Fathers at St Joseph College for their spiritual assistance and to everyone who contributed to build up this mission.
