Editorial

It ignores the sweet fragrance of the rose gardens and even in the best of circumstances, and in the tidiest places, the fly will focus on garbage and trash.

The honeybee is teaching us the art of focusing on the positive and on dealing appropriately with the adversities in life. There will be struggles everywhere and pain all the time. There will never be shortage of things to complain about but just as the honeybee seeks nectar even in the most unexpected of places, we can aim to seek the positive side of life and count the blessings and not the misery. On the other hand, the fly represents the mind-set of those ignoring the blessings focus on complaints. It is easy; it requires no effort to see the flaws and misfortunes.

Let there be a shift within us, a shift from the negative to the positive, from death to life as we move on to the New Year 2021! Let us cast our cares, worries in the hands of the Almighty God, and hear him say, "Those who hope in the Lord will renew their strength. They will soar on wings like eagles; they will run and not grow weary, they will walk and not be faint." (Isaiah 40:31). I wish and pray that the year 2021 keeps our Management, staff, students, parents and wellwishers healthy and safe.

was a beautiful learning by doing.







2. Student Development Activities

1.1 Innovations

- · Non-availability of trained teachers especially to teach Mathematics and Science.
- · Difficulty in to find qualified teachers in the village set up to teach in English Medium Schools.

The forward progress of every great human endeavour has come about through the work of a pioneer. In the sphere of education, we celebrate Helen Keller and her reforms in the teaching of the disabled children. In social action, we worship Mother Teresa for her works in the slums of Kolkata. In the world of race relations, we remember the words and examples of Dr Martin Luther King. When it comes to space exploration, we revere Neil Armstrong and his 'one small step.' All these people were pioneers. Pioneers are those who venture into the unknown territories. They lead the way for others. Raymond

Francis Camillus Mascarenhas was one of them. He was a forerunner of the Millennium Development Goals.

The Millennium Development Goals are eight international development goals that were established following the 'Millennium Summit' of United Nations in 2000. These goals were intended to increase 'human capabilities'. All UN Members and 23 organizations are committed to achieve the following goals:

6. To combat HIV/AIDS, malaria and other diseases;

8. To develop a global partnership for development;

4. To reduce child mortality;

1. To eradicate extreme poverty and hunger;

2. To achieve universal primary education:

- 3. To promote gender equality and empower women;
- 5. To improve maternal health;
- 7. To ensure environmental sustainability;

These goals placed emphasis on three areas:

- a) Human capital (nutrition, health care, education),
- b) Infrastructure
- c) Human Rights (social, economic and political), with the intent of increasing living standards

Birth and Vocation

Fr Raymond was born on January 23, 1875 to Lazarus and Joanna Mascarenhas in a devout Catholic family. At 16, he entered St Joseph Seminary, Mangalore. He was ordained a priest on March 4, 1900. As a priest, he was convinced that emancipation of the poor and women would come only through education. In 1914, he was appointed the first parish priest of St Sebastian Church, Bendur, Mangalore. Soon, he set up St Sebastian School in a small warehouse. He even set up St Martha Industrial School in Bethany premises. Other schools started by him were St Margaret Mary's at Bendur and St Joseph's at Kankanady. This was his early contribution towards achieving universal primary education way back in 1921 a millennium development goal which we are discussing in the 21 century.

Founding of Bethany

Fr Raymond was deeply pained to see the distress of many young women who could not get entry into the then existing religious Congregations. Therefore, on July 16, 1921, he founded the Congregation of the Sisters of the Little Flower of Bethany. It helped in three ways:

- a) Providing education for the poor especially for girls
- b) Providing opportunity for girls
- c) Providing good, dedicated, qualified permanent teachers to teach in schools.

Since then, the Bethany Educational Society has been imparting education to bring fullness of life for all especially to the poor, the marginalized and the girl child. This was yet another indicator of his vision to help achieve the millennium development goal "to promote gender equality and to empower women."

Retired life (1941-1955)

Though retired in name, he directed Bethany Congregation to new mission territories of Goa, Belgaum, Calicut and Mysore. In all these areas, Bethany Sisters involved themselves in social and educational activities. Great emphasis was laid on education of poor girls. However, the discriminatory attitude and gender biases stood in their way of making progress. But Raymond was a man of action. He knew that to fight evil one must tread the path of education. Today due to the dedication and selfless services of this great man in founding 'Bethany Congregation', it has reached the remotest corners of India and some parts of Europe and Africa too. It is as if, his activities have been translated into the development goals.

Voyage to Eternal Home (1960)

SD Raymond left for his eternal home peacefully on December 23, 1960 and was buried at St Sebastian Church, Mangalore. "When a light is lit it cannot be held within a short range. It is for the whole world." Msgr Raymond has lit the light to subdue the evil of illiteracy. The beams of this light have spread to all parts of our country and to the continents of Europe and Africa.

The work begun and established by the Servant of God Raymond FC Mascarenhas is and will continue to be a continual canticle of praise until the end of time. He was in all respects, a Forerunner of the Millennium Development Goals.
