She enumerated the 7 Core Values of Bethany Educational Society.

- **God Experience:** This is nothing but to be in His presence, listening to His voice in the silence of our heart and to be grateful always. Through awareness, silence and prayer we can experience the intimate love of Jesus in our life.
- **Compassionate Love for all especially the poor and the marginalized:** As compassion is an inborn quality we have to nurture it by becoming a VOICE to the SILENCE of loneliness, rejection, illiteracy, pain, fear, despair, hunger, women, girl children and death.
- **Communion, Collaboration and Team Spirit:** As the geese that have a perfect communion, collaboration and team spirit

- **Excellence in terms of developing each one's unique potentialities and to build a just and humane community:** "I am not a handsome man, but I can give my hand-to-someone". 

Soaring High on the Wings of Excellence...



Stella Maris Convent and School - Sultanpur, Uttar Pradesh

Stella Maris, the Star of the Ocean, began to shine on its horizon and brought in lot of cheer and hope on otherwise sleepy but politically active town in the eastern part of Uttar Pradesh. Originally known as Kushbhawanpura, it was re-named as Sultanpur which means city of beautiful vines, located on the banks of Gommti River.

In the year 1913, Ms Dora Beach and her sister Eva K Beach from America, came to India to carry on a fruitful Christian ministry and settled down at Sultanpur. After their death, the work was continued by Miss Florence Beuckman for some time. As she advanced in age the mission property was sold to the diocese of Allahabad. The then Bishop Raymond D' Mello approached Mother Macrina, Superior General of Bethany, to take over the mission at Sultapur. She readily accepted the invitation and sent Sr Canice, Sr Doyline, Sr Yoland and Sr Imani to pioneer the mission at Stella Maris Convent. The school was started on 11 July 1968 with 78 children. Sr Canice was the first Superior and Principal, and Fr Stephen Rodrigues, the first parish priest.

Initially the School was affiliated to UP Board and the classes were running up to Std VIII. Later, it was upgraded to Std X. In 1982 the first batch passed their X under UP board. At the request of parents, the Management got the school affiliated to the Central Board of Secondary



Education New Delhi on 1 May 1984. The hard work put in by the staff and students has brought in 100% results over the years.

Stella Maris Convent and school at Sultanpur had the privilege of celebrating its silver jubilee on 29 November 1992 under the dynamic leadership of Sr Jane Chantal, the Principal.

Stella Maris School, Primary and Secondary, are situated in two places because of growing student strength. A plot of land measuring 3.9 acres for the senior secondary school from V – XII at Narayanpur was procured on 11 November 2004. The foundation stone was laid on 13 April 2008 by Sr. Rose Celine, the then Assistant Provincial Superior. The school was upgraded to Senior Secondary on 2 April 2008.

Outreach Programmes:

- Lapta village was the centre where tailoring and other activities for women's welfare were carried on. Remedial classes for village school children and needle work classes are held in the school campus under the supervision of sisters.



They toiled hard to put up the first block of the school. The school was a blessing to the Sultanites. To quote an ex-student, "There was a void in the education field in Sultanpur. The old educational institutions were in disarray. The dispute between the rival management committees were an everyday affair. The staff members indulged in politics, and teaching became secondary..." In this bleak educational atmosphere, a ray of light came to Sultanur in the opening of SMC School.

During the six years of Sr Canice's tenure, the school established itself and came to be known as the best school in Sultanpur. The successive Principals – Sr Benedict, Sr James, Sr Zelig, Sr Esuria, Sr Jane Chantal, Sr Nynette, Sr Ophelia, Sr Elsie, Sr Grace Maria, Sr Alodia, Sr Benny and currently Sr Irene ably guided the destiny of the school with the cooperation of staff, students and parents.



- Prison ministry is carried on faithfully by the staff and the students. Resource persons are arranged to address the prisoners.



- Students of classes V – XII, visit the village schools once a month along with the staff in line with the goal of BES 'Fullness of life for all specially the marginalised, rural poor and the girls'. They interact with students and the villagers on topics – women empowerment, cleanliness, education of a girl child; class room visits with interactive sessions, street plays, group songs, and value based skits. Students contribute generously and give useful items to the village people, such as, stationery, dustbins, clothes and eatables. The outreach programme provides the students a broader platform to learn, explore and reflect on village life. This programme benefits the villagers as well as students to a great extent.

- To create awareness among the locals regular rallies are organized by the staff and students to stop the use of plastics as it creates havoc in the environment.
- Our young Stellites organized a grand exhibition on the theme 'Laudato Si'. Parents came in large numbers and witnessed the beautiful creation of God, its destruction and its restoration.
- On 'Workers' Day' along with workers of our school the Rickshaw pullers were invited for the programme and were honoured.

- Utkarsh Tripathi of VIIC secured 5th position and won a gift hamper with a certificate and a memento, in the 15th 'Conquest IQ Olympiad' held on 2nd May 2016.

Facilities:

The school has well set up laboratories, good library with a provision for digital teaching and a spacious playground. A tiny school with 78 students in 1968 has now on its role 3100 students, 81 dedicated staff and 19 supportive staff. The support of the diocese and services of parish priests are praiseworthy and are gratefully acknowledged. Not mindful of various problems and challenges posed by the society, SMC School continues to impart value based quality education with an aim to make its students light bearers of the society. May Stella Maris live long touching the lives of many and thus build a better society and better India.
