

Bethany EM High School, Uppudi



Uppudi, a small village in Konaseema Islands is located in East Godavari District of Andhra Pradesh. Konaseema is an oasis of enchanting beauty, peace and tranquillity. It is one of the fertile lands on the Coramandal Coast. The entire region of Konaseema is a delta situated on both the Districts of East Godavari and West Godavari, rich in mangroves, coconut trees and fields. It is popularly called as Andhra's Kerala.

The missionary spirit of the Sisters from Southern Province tirelessly went in search of a suitable place in Andhra Pradesh and entered into the soil of Uppudi, a small village.

The Uppudi village is comparatively backward in all respects. A good portion of the local population consists of Hindus and Muslims, where caste system is very dominant. The coastal area also comprises of fishermen. The land is prone to frequent floods; the marshy land is uncongenial for cultivation. The salty water adds to the woes of the inhabitants. The health conditions of the native are deplorable. No hospital services are available in the vicinity.

Considering the educational backwardness of the area and keeping in mind of their upliftment, Bethany ventured into this village with a challenge.

On 12 June 2009 with the help of few well-wishers, using the terrace of the Convent building as their class room the Bethany English Medium High School, Uppudi got started with 40 children in the LKG. Lack of space and increasing number of students made us to shift our school to a spacious place and a new building. It was blessed on 21 May 2011 by Rt Rev Msgr Abraham Vellarankala, the Vicar for Religious of Eluru Diocese and was inaugurated by Rev Sr Anseline, the then Provincial Superior of Southern Province. The school that was started on terrace with 40 students in LKG has at present 490 on its roll and the number keeps increasing year after year. By the hard labour of Sr Judy Varghese and Sr Annie George this school got State recognition for the Upper Primary school in the year 2011.


The administration of the school was handed over to Sr Sheeja Mathew by Sr Annie George on 1 June 2011, after a years' dedicated service. On 1 June 2012 Sr Sherly Abraham took the reins of the school as the Principal for a

period of two years and handed over the same to Sr Silvi Augustine on 1 June 2014. After the valuable services Sr Silvi for three years the administration was handed over to Sr Deena John on 19 May 2017.

Sr Silvi Augustine, the then Principal and Sr Santhosh Maria, the Corporate Manager, succeeded in getting recognition from the Government (class VIII-X) on 25 January 2016, which was

100% result in the Board Examiniation.

Apart from the curricular activities, the school also gives prime attention towards co-curricular activities like karate, yoga etc. The character formation of students is taken care through value education and catechism. The parents cooperate with the Management whole heartedly and there exists a healthy relationship between the parents and the school. The committed staff is indeed a boon. With the untiring efforts of the Management and the staff the school is growing steadily.

Bethany Convent exists in another plot of land 50 mtrs away from the school. Initially it had minimum comforts. Its renovation was carried out effectively in view of a Convent and a Chapel. On May 2008, the house was blessed by Msgr Rev Dr Belthasar, at the Holy Eucharistic celebration. The formal erection of the Bethany Convent at Uppudi was done during the Mass by Rev Sr Jyoti, the then Superior General in the presence of Sr Theresild the then Provincial Superior, Sr Judy Varghese, Sr Annie George, Sr Merlyn and Sr Rani Maria as the pioneering members. The sisters were engaged in pastoral care, social work, and education.

Sr Judy Varghese an experienced administrator took charge as the Superior of the Convent for four years, followed by Sr Sheeba Anto. From June 2017 under the dynamic leadership of Sr Nirmala Mary the Superior, Sr Deena John, Sr Dayana Peter and Sr Elizebeth Rani successfully integrate the charism and spirituality of the Founder in the mission of Bethany.

Social Work:

In 2009, under the self-motivated leadership of Sr Judy Varghese, the social work was carried on meticulously at Uppudi. An agency called MANOS UNIDAS Spain offered a project 'Integrated Rural Development with an emphasis on Sustainable Development through Community Based Development Programmes. This project helped Bethany to reach out to thousands of rural poor in 30 villages. They have come to realize their potential to design their own lives. After the completion of the first phase of the Project, the Agency which was satisfied

with the services of Bethany extended the Project to the second phase under the guidance of Sr Reji Kuriakose, Sr Annie George and Sr Soumya John. It got completed in the year 2018.

Thus Bethany in the soil of Uppudi village tries to fulfil the dream and aspirations of our beloved Founder, Servant of God RFC Mascarenhas. We are extremely grateful to our dear Congregation and the Bethany Educational Society for their whole hearted financial support, timely guidance and valuable suggestions. May the presence of Bethany at Uppudi, bring peace and harmony among the people.


